2. What is the story behind the curve?

- Top 1-3 Bright Spots and Why (Based on Community, Family, and School Input):
 1. High student satisfaction rate on the Climate and Safety Survey, at or above the state average
 2. 22-23 KSA Data shows NWMS above the state average in Math/Reading, while NWES Barely below state average
 3. 76% of students are not chronically absent.

 1. Continued improvement in Family Engagement that will lead to student academic growth
