1. Population, Desired Results, and Indicators

ALL students

- are physically, mentally, socially and emotionally healthy.

- experience robust partnerships between school, family and community.
- succeed academically and elementary students enter Kindergarten ready to learn.

Attendance, Behavior, and Course/Academic Performance are the headline indicators that will be monitored to see if we are achieving the desired results above.

2. What is the story behind the curve?

- Top 1-3 Bright Spots and Why (Based on Community, Family, and School Input):
 - ★ New Principal, Monique Lewis became the principal of Freedom Elementary in October 2024. Parents report communication has improved.
 - ★ Mrs. Lewis calls parents after a Parent Square post is sent to parent
 - ★ School Climate and Culture have improved.
 - ★ Parent Engagement Team - driving force behind each Family Engagement Night.
 - ★ Parent Fall & Spring Studer Survey results indicate parent engagement is better with the Family Engagement Nights
 - ★ Chronic Absenteeism Rate - 27.1%, lower than the state (28%)
 - ★ Principal wrote a comment on each student's 3rd nine weeks report card
 - ★ Teacher to Parent communication has improved - per Parent Studer results

● Top 1-3 Areas of Concern and Why (Based on Community, Family, and School Input):

1. Novice scores in reading and math - MAP & MasteryConnect scores for the Fall, Winter, & Spring indicate a high percentage of students in each grade scoring novice
2. Teacher Classroom Behavior Management - teachers are not consistent with procedures
3. Parent Engagement - We need more parents to come to events and conferences to ensure consistent communication throughout the year.
