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
How Are Students Doing On The Path To A Successful Life?

The Groundswell Profiles invite Kentuckians in every community to join in a groundswell of education action. They rest on two deep convictions:

- Education is part of a path to a larger life for Kentucky's people
- A groundswell of public engagement can build a pathway wide enough for all to flourish.

If we build a groundswell of public action, we can develop each learner's unique strengths and open a pathway to a larger life for all.



Over 85% of brain development occurs before age 5. The return on investment for early childhood is \$5 for every \$1 invested.

Achievement in 8th grade is a critical indicator of whether a student is prepared for increased challenges in high school.

Kids who start kindergarten behind are less likely to reach proficiency later in school.

At this point, students increasingly need to "read to learn" so proficiency is critical. Similarly, early math skills are essential building blocks for higher level work."

High school graduation is a minimum and necessary step in the transition to college and a career.

62% of jobs in Kentucky require some level of education beyond high school.

Not only do more jobs now require some education after high school, but earnings for those with bachelor's degree are 50% higher than those without a degree.

Due to the impact of COVID-19 on learning, academic outcomes have changed dramatically due to circumstances related to the pandemic.

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




Kindergarten Readiness




Grade 3 Reading Proficiency




Grade 3 Math Proficiency




Grade 8 Reading Proficiency




Grade 8 Math Proficiency




Four-Year High School Graduation Rate




Postsecondary Readiness

Postsecondary Degree Attainment






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HOW FAR ALONG ARE STUDENTS FROM DIFFERENT BACKGROUNDS?
