to age 3 and their families. First Steps is Kentucky's response to the federal Infant-Toddler Program.

First Steps is implemented through 15 regional Points of Entry. The focus of the program is to increase child functioning and help parents learn strategies to enhance their child's growth and learning.

The ECMHP is implemented through the 14 regional Community Mental Health Centers (CMHC). Each CMHC employs an Early Childhood Mental Health Specialist who serves as the regional ECMH expert.

The Specialists' time is devoted solely to their regional ECMH programs and building regional capacity to more effectively meet the behavioral health needs of young children and their families. This is achieved through the primary goals of the ECMH Program:

- Indirect services: programand child-level observation/ consultation on social, emotional, and behavioral issues to programs that serve children age birth through five,

Certified Prevention Specialists can also provide communities with technical assistance, trainings for medical offices, linkages to services, etc.
