Kentucky's National Rankings Report

In 2020, the Prichard Committee urged all Kentuckians to join the work of creating a Big Bold Future for our Commonwealth. This report is the second update showing Kentucky's progress on our set of indicators.

Bluntly, the new evidence is troubling.

There is some good news. It's especially important that Kentucky is moving back toward 2019 reading and math results, and we're doing that more successfully than most other states.

But we aren't back to our 2019 reading and math levels, and 2019 performance wasn't strong enough. On many other indicators, we've seen declines or very small progress.

The Prichard Committee now calls on our whole state to respond to this hard news with fresh energy and determination. As people who love Kentucky, let's join together and get to work on building deeper insights, deeper engagement, and deeper investment, both at the state level and in each of our local communities. We invite you to explore the evidence on the pages that follow and join us in renewed efforts to make education Kentucky's pathway to a larger life and a Big Bold Future for all of us.



Early Childhood Rank over time


BABIES WITH A HEALTHY BIRTH WEIGHT

- 92.0% of babies born in Connecticut in 2022 had healthy birth weight, ranking them 20th.


CHILDREN ABOVE POVERTY

PRESCHOOL PARTICIPATION (AGES 3-4)




Declining/Flat

K-12 Learning Rank over time


4TH GRADE READING PROFICIENCY

- 32% of Louisiana grade 4 students scored proficient or above on 2024 NAEP reading, ranking them 20th.


8TH GRADE MATH PROFICIENCY

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION



Postsecondary Rank over time


POSTSECONDARY ENROLLMENT (18-24)


- 41% of undergraduates who entered Kentucky two-year public higher education in 2019 graduated by 2022, ranking us 4th.


Strong Trend




Declining/Flat



MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME





- 92.3% of Arizona households had high speed internet access in 2023, ranking them 20th.






BABIES WITH A HEALTHY BIRTH WEIGHT




CHILDREN AT OR ABOVE POVERTY




4TH GRADE READING PROFICIENCY






GRADUATION FROM 2-YEAR INSTITUTIONS




GRADUATION FROM 4-YEAR INSTITUTIONS




ASSOCIATE DEGREE OR HIGHER (25-64)

Action Recommendations

Community Mobilization

To build Kentucky's Big Bold Future, create a groundswell of engagement in public education, using local strengths to meet local challenges. That engagement can include a wide array of approaches to improving student outcomes, including examples like these:

- Kindergarten readiness campaigns
- Reading and math tutors recruited by civic organizations
- · Real-world learning opportunities through partnerships with local businesses
- Community-driven FAFSA completion efforts
- Locally-developed expectations for meaningful high school diplomas
- · Parent-led and student-led projects to enhance school climate and culture
- · Coordinated and aligned community services to remove non-academic barriers to learning

State Policy

Early Childhood

- Invest more deeply in the quality and affordability of childcare
- Implement strategies to deliver quality preschool and quality childcare in shared locations
- Expand HANDS, Kentucky's voluntary home visiting program for families with children under age 3

K-12 Learning

- Ensure that all students have access to rigorous coursework
- Sustain statewide initiatives to build educators' literacy and math teaching skills
- Deepen attention to teaching quality, working conditions, and shortages
- Strengthen SEEK funding, including meeting full transportation costs

- Expand quality college-level work opportunities in high school
- Invest more heavily to make undergraduate credentials affordable


