**Christian County High School Community School Action Plan
Snapshot**

1. Population, Desired Results, and Indicators

Christian County High School aims to ensure that all students are healthy in all aspects, prepared for future success, supported by stable environments, and benefit from strong school, family, and community partnerships. Academic success and readiness for kindergarten are key goals. Progress will be monitored through indicators like attendance, behavior, and academic performance.

2. What is the story behind the curve?

Christian County High School Bright Spots include the Profile of a Graduate Program, which is a part of every Christian County Schools student's school experience from elementary through high school. CCHS has a counselor for each grade level. Another Bright Spot is the Gateway Academy which offers a number of CTE Pathways. CCHS offers students with due credit opportunities. School culture and the Youth Services Center are considered bright spots for services offered and new principals and teachers with innovative ideas. However, CCHS recognizes that Chronic Absenteeism is an issue as well as reported behavior incidences at the school are rising. Transportation is an issues. Health issues such as mental health and vaping are also concerns.

3. Locally Set Indicators (based on Areas of Concern)

Strategies for Active Family and Community Engagement

- CCHS will enhance the existing new year Open House by providing a mental and purchasing t-shirts to enhance school spirit and a sense of belonging. Parents will be encouraged to sign up to volunteer at the school. (August 2024)
- Every nine weeks CCHS will offer a new strategy Family Engagement Nights/Colonel Family Cafe. Four local churches will collaborate by providing meals to families as they listen to community and school staff present on pertinent topics. (4X 2024-2025)
- The recognized mentoring programs, Men2Be and Lipstick After Dark, will invite families and students to a kickoff which provides an opportunity to sign up for the program and receive numerous resources. (August 2024)
- CCHS will begin the certification of becoming a Family Friendly School by assembling a team by end of Oct 2024 and complete the self-assessment (Oct 2024)

Strategies for Integrated Student Supports

- CCHS will enhance the existing Colonel Commitment Day by collaborating with community organizations to offer workshops on life and work skills to students. (Nov 2024)
- CCHS will expand on the Jumpstart program by providing incentives for families, a meal and inviting community partners to speak to families about career/pathways offered in Hopkinsville County. (Summer 2024)
- CCHS will work with community partners to offer a Lunch and Learn/Colonel Conversations program. Community role models will meet with students during lunch weekly and engage in conversations as well as offer postsecondary advice. (Sept-May)

Strategies for Expanded and Enriched Learning Time and Opportunities

- CCHS will expand on the Men 2 Be mentoring and leadership program by offering monthly sessions for HS males regarding mental health, self-esteem, and life skills. (Sept-April)
- CCHS will expand on the Lipstick After Dark girls mentoring and leadership program by bringing the sessions to campus to encourage participation. (Sept-April)
- CCHS will collaborate with the Youth Services Center and community organizations to offer the new Summer Fun Days, which feature no cost engagement opportunities for families in the community during the summer months (May-August 2024)

Strategies for Collaborative Leadership and Practices to Support High-Quality Teaching

- CCHS will promote and encourage parent leaders to be trained in the CIPL program. (August-Feb)
- CCHS will continue to hold monthly Local Leadership Meetings and Community Meetings 4x yearly to share data, inform, and allow community input in the Community Schools grant initiative.
